"No experience necessary! Start at \$1,100 per week! Return this card for more information on how you can obtain a job today."

People often believe advertisements like this are true because there are so many of them. Con artists use bogus job opportunities to lure you in, then you have to send a fee in order to get full information, such as a job listing for the area. They always guarantee you placement and say that no experience is necessary. This type of mail fraud is easy to fall for because it offers something everyone wants: a well-paying job

Check the company out first, and then ask lots of questions before you send any money. Some job opportunity companies are legitimate, but even so, they are selling job lists anyone can obtain from a library, the federal government or local business development office. Consult these yourself instead of paying someone to do it for you.
