

Job Leads Sources

- Apply directly to an employer without suggestions or referrals by anyone
- Ask relatives about jobs where they work or about jobs
- Ask friends about jobs where they work or about jobs
- Go to WorkZone your local Employment Resource Centre.
- Go to your local Human Resources and Skills Development Canada Centre
- Call private employment agencies or drop off your resume and arrange for interviews
- Answer newspaper classifieds, check the financial pages, and examine articles about new projects and developments. Daily copies of both local and non-local newspapers are available at WorkZone and the Okanagan Regional Library
- Place ads in a local newspaper
- Conduct an electronic job search on the Internet at WorkZone
- Submit you E-Resume to the many job banks on the Internet Register with the Public Service Commission (Federal Government) at www.jobs.gc.ca
- Look through the Yellow Pages of local and non-local telephone books
- Contact local organizations and associations, Volunteer, Hospital/Medical, Health & Welfare, Youth, Labour, Chamber of Commerce, Board of Trade
- Contact school, college and university placement officer.
- Contact department heads of the various firms in you area by telephone and arrange for an informational interview.
- Ask an instructor, teacher or professor for job leads.
- Check bulletin boards of hospitals, municipal or city hall, downtown boards and businesses.
- Consult Library Resource Directories, Association Lists and out-of-town phone books
